



Table Tennis England did a feature on Krish Chotai after his magnificent wins qualified him for the National Championships where he qualified in 7<sup>th</sup> place out of a field of 114 players over the weekend. Krish had 8 unexpected wins. Howard Onweng also qualified for the National Championships in 12<sup>th</sup> place.
