

# SURREY SENIORS PROMOTED TO 1ST DIVISION

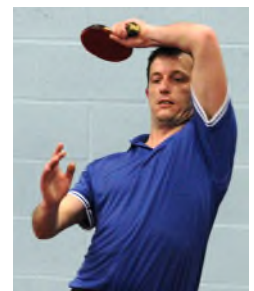
